About the Coach:

Brian Lint grew up in the local Lee's Summit area playing club soccer for several local coaches. He graduated from Blue Ridge Christian School as a 4 year varsity letterman where he was named to 2 all area teams, 5 all tournament teams, and one all tournament MVP. He had broken several school records including most assists in a season and most assists in a career.

During high school, Brian was selected to U17 boys Missouri state ODP (Olympic Development Program) team and attended regional camp.

At U17, Brian played for a regional team that played tournaments in Wales, Scotland and Netherlands. While there, he had an opportunity to play against the Chile, Wales, and Yugoslavia national teams and several professional club teams.

Brian attended John Brown University and was a 4 year varsity letterman. During his freshman year, the team posted a 16-5 record, finished as district champions and ranked 17th nationally. His sophomore year, the team posted a 17-3-1 record, finished as area champions and lost in the national tournament to the national champions in double overtime. They finished the season ranked 3rd nationally. During his junior year, the team posted a 15-3-1 ranking and was eliminated in district play. They finished the season ranked 13th in the nation. During his senior year, the team experienced many injuries to several of the players and ended the season with 4-13-1 record. Brian played against several schools in the Kansas City area including Rockhurst, Baker, Avila, William Jewel, and Park.

Brian holds a USSF "C" National License and has coached youth soccer for several years.

Brian had previously coached a team within this same age group and took two years off to focus on coaching his younger son. He is looking for committed players that want to play high school soccer and beyond. He enjoys developing kids to be well-rounded soccer players.
